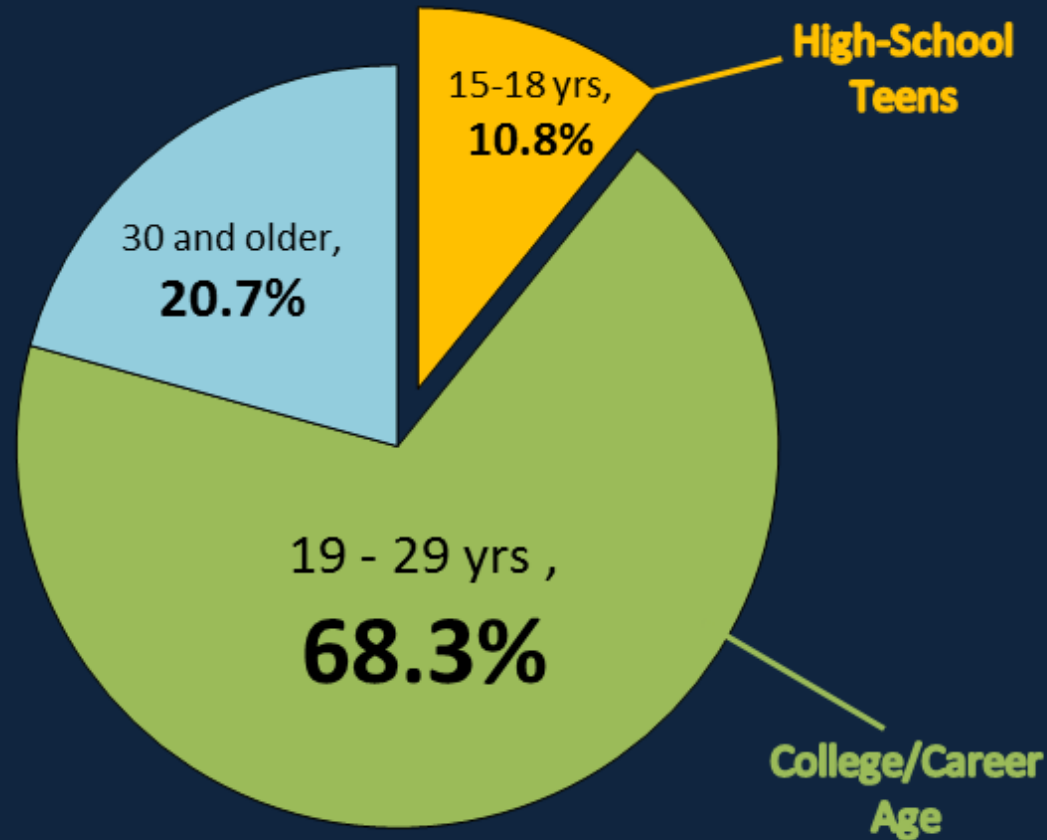

³Includes all persons of Hispanic origin of any race; see references 1 and 5.
